THE IMPACT OF SC BOOST



Overview

Launched in 2024, SC BOO\$T is a pilot program designed to deliver one-time wage supplements directly to early childhood professionals in South Carolina. The program is created in response to data revealing low wages for the early childhood workforce. Amounts were distributed per the SC Endeavors Registry Career Ladder level and were divided between two 6-month payments. SC BOO\$T is administered by the South Carolina Department of Social Services' SC Endeavors program and is federally-funded through the American Rescue Plan Act.





Why is SC BOO\$T Important?

Early childhood educators play a crucial role in a child's early development, yet they are often underpaid despite the high level of responsibility they carry. Better wages would help retain skilled educators, improve the quality of care, and recognize the value of their work in shaping future generations.

The Impact of SC BOO\$T

Two Rounds of Payments



Round 1 payments were distributed to **9,370** early childhood professionals for a total of **\$12,776,050**.

Round 2 payments were distributed to **8,620** early childhood professionals for a total of **\$12,255,610**.

In total, SC BOO\$T distributed **\$25,031,660** to early childhood professionals in South Carolina!

Early Care and Education Turnover




There is a 15%-25% turnover rate of early childhood professionals nationally.
